JAPON dance project

JAPON dance project was formed by five top-flight Japanese choreographers: **Mimoza KOÏKE** (Les Ballets de Monte-Carlo), **Yasuyuki ENDO** (former soloist with the Ballet National de Marseille), **Naoya AOKI** (freelance dancer and choreographer), **Masahiro YANAGIMOTO** (freelance dancer and choreographer) and **Hokuto KODAMA** (former soloist with the Royal Ballet of Sweden). All five members are based in Europe or Japan.

In May 2013, **LE LOGOSCOPE** – the laboratory for multimedia artistic research based in the Principality of Monaco – welcomed the programme at the initiative of Mimoza KOÏKE, the Vice President.

JAPON dance project works within the context of contemporary artistic practices in which Japanese culture imagines itself both here and elsewhere through the language of choreography. They therefore collaborate regularly with other guest artists.

Every two years they create original new choreographic works that reflect their vast knowledge and research interests. These pieces are presented and produced by the **NEW NATIONAL THEATRE OF JAPAN** in Tokyo.

JAPON Dance Project presented its first Production/Manifesto, **LE PARADIS DES FOURMIS**, at ESDC Rosella Hightower in Cannes (with the support of EU JAPAN FEST) on 24 and 25 August 2013. This event anticipated their invitation to perform at the NEW NATIONAL THEATRE OF JAPAN, where they have already presented two original new productions: **CLOUD/CROWD** on 30 and 31 August 2014, and **MOVE/STILL** on 27 and 28 August 2016, which was also performed as part of the programme of events celebrating the 10th anniversary of diplomatic relations between the Principality of Monaco and Japan, supported by SO.GE.DA.-MONACO and H.E. Monsieur Patrick Medecin, Ambassador of Monaco to Japan.

They are currently preparing their next original new production, which will be presented on 25 and 26 August 2018 at the NEW NATIONAL THEATRE OF JAPAN in Tokyo. The third instalment of this magnificent trilogy is entitled **SUMMER/NIGHT/DREAM**, a project in perpetual motion created by **Mimoza KOÏKE, Yasuyuki ENDO and Masahiro YANAGIMOTO**.

BIOGRAPHIES

MIMOZA KOÏKE

Dancer-choreographer

Born in Tokyo in 1982.

Lives in Roquebrune-Cap Martin and works in Monaco.

In 2000 MIMOZA graduated with distinction from the Conservatoire National Supérieur de Musique et de Danse in Lyon, and went on to join the Jeune Ballet du Conservatoire de Lyon before entering the Ballet du Grand Théâtre in Geneva in 2001. Since 2003 she has danced with Les Ballets de Monte-Carlo, directed by Jean-Christophe Maillot, and was promoted to first soloist in 2005. MIMOZA's superb artistry and unique technical abilities have also made her a favourite dancer among the guest choreographers Jean-Christophe Maillot has invited to work with the company, including Sidi Larbi Cherkaoui, Jiri Kylián, William Forsythe, Johan Inger, Matjash Mrozewski, Emilio Greco, Pieter C. Scholten, Inna Yohanson, Alexander Ekmann, Natalia Horecna, Vladimir Varnava and Marie Chouinard. She is also a popular performer in repertory works by choreographers such as George Balanchine, Nijinsky and Maurice Béjart.

Since 2007 she has developed her skills as a choreographer through the Imprévis Jeunes Chorégraphes/Jeunes Scénographes workshops for young choreographers and set designers at the Ateliers des Ballets de Monte-Carlo (in partnership with ESAP-Pavillon Bosio), and has created pieces such as Voisinages (2007); U Turn (2008 – co-created with Jérôme Marchand); Rossignols (2010); Ichi Ni San and Kodama (2012). In 2008 she also created a solo piece, Amenimo, for a gala in Tokyo. In 2015 and 2016 she participated in the PAS CROISÉS programme led by Gaëtan Morlotti at the Musée National Marc Chagall in Nice, a collaboration between the museum and Les Ballets de Monte-Carlo. She has since returned to take part in two new performances in November 2017 and March 2018.

Since 2010 MIMOZA has co-directed Le Logoscope – the laboratory for mixed media artistic research in Monaco – with Agnès Roux, becoming its Vice President in 2016. In 2013 she launched JAPON dance project, the performing arts group dedicated to choreographic research and creation, with four other Japanese dancers and choreographers: Yasuyuki Endo, Hokuto Kodama, Naoya Aoki and Masahiro Yanagimoto. Together they created and performed Paradis des Fourmis in 2013 at the ESDC Rosella Hightower in Cannes, Cloud/Crowd in 2014 and Move/Still in 2016 for the New National Theatre of Japan in Tokyo. In 2015 she co-created the installation performance Révolution Agricole with Bruno Roque and Agnès Roux.

In 2015 she was appointed Chevalier de l'ordre du Mérite Culturel by His Serene Highness Albert II of Monaco.

YASUYUKI ENDO

Dancer-choreographer

Born in Tokyo in 1969

Lives and works in Tokyo

In 1991 Yasuyuki Endo joined the Star Dancers Ballet Tokyo company, moving to the Australian Ballet in 1994, before returning to the Star Dancers Ballet Tokyo in 1996. In 1998 he received the 10th Muramatsu Award in Japan.

From 1999 to 2004 he danced with Charleroi Danses plan-k in Belgium, where he collaborated with Frédéric Flamand. He choreographed Haoto for the Passerelles project (Belgium) and Chain for the Aoyama ballet festival in Japan.

He formed the performing arts group BOnoBOS with Taka Shamoto, and created productions and workshops with The Saison Foundation in Japan. He also danced with Saburo Teshigawara in I was real document and Turandot.

In 2005 Yasuyuki Endo joined the Ballet National de Marseille as a soloist and choreographer, creating productions such as MAYDAY MAYDAY MAYDAY This is..., DOJYOJI+, Té TO Té and 3 in Passacaglia. He is also the Rehearsal Director. In 2008 he created Kaeru for the NBA Ballet in Tokyo, and in 2009 Super MAN Project episode 1, which was presented at the Berlin International Dance Film Festival.

In 2010 he took the Super MAN Project to the Musée d'Art Contemporain in Marseille, and was invited to lead a workshop for the Architanz studio in Tokyo. Since 2011 he has organised the All Nippon Ballet Gala Dance Festival in Yokohama and Tokyo, in aid of the Tohoku earthquake disaster, as well as the Gala for Fukushima. He also choreographed LOVE LOVE ROBOT <junkie of happiness> for SDB Tokyo, and, in 2013, Da.Da.Ma.Da.MAD for the opening of Marseille-Provence 2013, European Capital of Culture.

In 2013 he co-founded the JAPON dance project, a performing arts group based in Le Logoscope – Monaco, with four other choreographers. JDP was invited to perform at the New National Theatre Tokyo in August 2014 and August 2016.

In 2015 he also became artistic director of the Yokohama Ballet Festival.

He currently leads Endo Ballet Tokyo and continues to work as a choreographer, festival organiser and teacher in Japan and Europe.



MASAHIRO YANAGIMOTO

Dancer-choreographer

Born in Osaka in 1976

Lives and works in Tokyo

In 1988 Masahiro Yanagimoto played in a children's theatre group, which gave him the opportunity of acting in a television series. Following this he studied jazz dance. In 1994 he took an intensive training course in classical dance with the Art Ballet Naniwatsu company. In 1996 he was awarded second prize in the Kobe Dance Competition and won a lead role in Shéhérazade for the Kaisai Ballet Association.

In 1998 he left to work in Germany as a soloist with the Staatstheater Braunschweig, then with Tanz Theater in Munich alongside Pierre Wyss. From 2000 to 2002 he danced with Tanz Theater with Philip Taylor and began his career in contemporary dance.

In 2002 he moved to the Netherlands and joined Ballet Scapino in Rotterdam. In 2004 he danced with the Conny Janssen Danst company, and entered Dance Galili in 2005.

In 2006 he returned to live and work in Japan as a choreographer, freelance dancer, professor and leader of W.

At the same time, he developed his choreographic style with fellow dancer and choreographer Naoya Aoki, and formed his own company called +81.

In 2008 he co-founded C/society with Shintaro Ooe and toured Europe with IKI SI TAI.

LE LOGOSCOPE

Laboratory for mixed media artistic research

Principality of Monaco

Since its creation in 1997, this structure welcomes **professional creators** to experiment and develop so-called current artistic practices favoring **language crossovers, sharing of knowledge** as well as **collaborative forms**.

This imaginary scientific apparatus for examining language* offers its artists-researchers the opportunity to question art in its capacity to boost social dialogue and the transversality of knowledge, while being **attentive to cultural, environmental and economic changes**. The anchorage on its territory of belonging is the reflection of the **plural laboratory of ideas and creations with an international influence**, that is the Principality of Monaco.

The logoscope rely on three platforms - **Visual Arts, Performing Arts, Sound Arts** - to **promote the mastery of disciplines and their connections** in specific research and creative programs. Focusing on slow processes and the art of meeting, he operates a continuous interaction between **individual prospects and collective situations** but also, between **traditional and innovative mediums**.

Its Office, meanwhile, promotes the forms and expertises of its authors through personalized services, the creation of events, the diffusion of works produced and the publishing.
